### Program Purpose/Description:

The Bachelor in Nursing (RN to BSN) program expands the knowledge of licensed nurses to enable them to become leaders in providing high-quality, evidence-based patient-centered care in the health care environments. The program consists of ten eight-week terms offered 2 evenings a week with the remaining time online for a total of 60 credits in 80 weeks. Students must transfer in 60 credits from a nationally or regionally accredited college as outlined to be eligible for admission into this program.
